Reserve **Master Plans**



Council is developing draft **Master Plans for Lois Twohig Reserve in Dandenong**

North and Spring Valley Reserve in Springvale South, and we want to hear from residents.

Lois Twohig Reserve, in Carlton Road, is home to sporting clubs, a playground, tennis courts, sports ovals, a dog off leash area, a pétanque court and fitness equipment and also has a retarding basin.

A Master Plan will ensure the reserve serves the community now and into the future and will help Council plan for projects and advocate for funding to complete them over the short, medium and longer term.

Spring Valley Reserve started life as a landfill site and has been undergoing works to become open space for the community since it closed in 1998.



Recently new topsoil and grass has been installed to help the park meet **Environment Protection Authority Victoria** (EPA) requirements.

Now Council wants to create a draft Master Pan to ensure this park meets the future needs of our community. The reserve has extensively grassed area with trails and features a picnic and barbecue area, a basketball half-court, dog off leash area, two playgrounds, a public toilet, fitness equipment and a beach volleyball court.

Tree canopy grows



Council is proud to report that sustained efforts to plant more trees has paid off, with an increase in canopy tree cover across our city.

With climate change affecting our environment, increasing our tree coverage is one way to reduce the impact of increasing temperatures, reduced rainfall and the growing number of storm and bushfire events.

A recent audit of canopy cover in Greater Dandenong revealed the coverage has increased from just 9 per cent in 2018 to 14 per cent, which puts us on track to reach our goal of 15 per cent by 2028.

This increase is a result of significant efforts by Council and the community, including the planting of 20,000 semimature trees over the past 10 years. Mother nature also supported these plantings with generous rainfall coming at the right time.



For Council, this time of year is the start of planting season with new street and park trees, tube stock and regenerative planting all set to begin. Community planting days and the One Tree Per Child initiative will also return for 2024.

Council's Urban Forest Strategy 2021-28 aims to create a healthy, green and resilient city that improves our resiliency to climate change and improves the health of our community.

By strategically planting more trees in locations of greatest need and advocating for greater quality landscaping and canopy trees on privately owned land, Council aims to increase our canopy cover to create more shade and habitat for wildlife.

I am proud to represent the people of Dandenong Ward and will always work

to get the best for the community of **Greater Dandenong.**

I am pleased to note that Council passed it's 2024-25 Budget recently, and within the Budget we made provision to progress towards building the new Dandenong aquatic facility to replace the ageing Dandenong Oasis.

Over the past 12 months several big projects were completed in my ward including the WJ Crowe Pavilion at Thomas Carroll Reserve. The beautiful new pavilion includes four change rooms with associated amenities, a new social/multipurpose room, canteen and a timekeepers room. Opened in December 2023 the \$6 million project was funded with grants from the State Government (\$500,000) and AFL Victoria (\$100,000).

Another major project in Dandenong Ward will benefit drivers who travel on Abbotts Road through Dandenong South. The \$5 million project saw the road widened to two lanes in each direction between Taylors Road and the Cranbourne railway line. New pedestrian paths were added, while stormwater drainage and street lighting were upgraded. Traffic lights were also added at the Taylors Road intersection and National Drive intersection. These improvements have already resulted

in improvements to traffic flow and the reduction of congestion.

Recent works at the George Andrews Pavilion have made the ground more welcoming to players, supporters and other visitors, and ongoing works will make this space even more inviting. The new playground is due for completion this month and a lighting upgrade on field one is due to be completed later this year following a power upgrade to the ground.

Noble Park North Ward



In 2012 I first noticed Stud Road did not have a safe pedestrian crossing near the

Dandenong Stadium and I decided I wanted to ensure our community would have safe access on this extremely dangerous stretch of road. It was one of the main reasons I ran for Council in 2020 and I'm thrilled the State Government announced in the May 2024 Budget to fund the construction of a signalised crossing, this makes me incredibly humbled that advocacy and standing for what is right can have a huge impact on our communities.

Another reason I ran for council was to ensure the entire city, but particularly my ward, had adequate sporting facilities, open space, renewed playgrounds, exercise equipment, improved roads, drainage and footpaths.

Since being elected in 2020 I have had an incredible amount of capital improvement projects delivered including:

- ► Brand new park and play equipment in Hennesy Way, Dandenong North \$100,000
- ► Brand new playground, exercise equipment, fencing and walking path at Browns Road Reserve, Noble Park North \$200,000
- ► Federal Blackspot funding for Browns Road, Noble Park North \$400,000



- ► Stage 1, 2 and 3 of the Barry Powell Reserve Masterplan \$457,000 so far
- ➤ Works at Heritage Kindergarten \$105,000
- Kitchen and changeroom facility upgrades at WJ Turner Reserve \$210,000
- ► Plans are moving forward for a kitchen upgrade and new pitches masterplan for Lyndale United Soccer Club with these projects set to be undertaken across 2024–25

- ► Upgrades to Bakers Reserve \$250,000
- ► Upgrades to Madison Reserve \$100.000
- Kerb and channelling works throughout the ward
- Improved footpaths throughout the ward

Road safety initiatives totalling \$250,000 including:

- ► School crossing on Manning Drive
- ► Pedestrian refuge on Bakers Road
- ► Pedestrian Refuge on Halton Rd
- ► Traffic calming on Templewood Ave and Frognal Drive

I have also had the honour of being elected as a Victorian Local Governance Association board member. The VLGA plays a pivotal role in shaping our community and ensuring councillors are equipped to focus and serve. I look forward to being the only voice from the south east on the VLGA so we can make our sector better equipped to serve communities.

Council Elections





Council Elections Day will be held on Saturday 26 October 2024. New councillors will

be elected across all 11 wards in **Greater Dandenong.**

Under the Local Government Act 2020. the Victorian Electoral Commission (VEC) conducts the election process on behalf of Council. The 2024 elections will be held by postal voting.

If you are a resident of Greater Dandenong and are not yet enrolled to vote you have until 4pm on Wednesday 7 August to register. Check your enrolment details are up to date, or enrol to vote at vec.vic.gov.au or by phone on 131 832.

Ward Boundaries

The VEC recently undertook a ward boundary review, which resulted in minor changes to the boundaries to ensure an even number of residents will vote in each ward.

The review attracted 213 submissions in response to a preliminary report and decided to make adjustments to the boundaries of seven of the 11 wards.

The main changes include the green wedge area of Lyndhurst moving to sit in Keysborough South Ward, the industrial area north of Eumemmerring Creek moving into Dandenong Ward and the green wedge and caravan park south of the creek moving into Keysborough Ward.

Other minor adjustments happened in Springvale Central, Springvale North, Springvale South and Yarraman wards.

Residents will receive a ballot pack relating to the ward in which they are eligible to vote.

Council enrolled voters


Previously called the CEO list, council enrolled voters are not automatically enrolled to vote in Greater Dandenong, but certain rules allow voters to register.

A letter detailing the requirements for council enrolled voters has been sent to all potential voters. Application forms included with the letter need to be returned to Council by 4pm on Wednesday 7 August.

If you apply to be on the list of council enrolled voters and are accepted, it will be compulsory for you to vote. Application forms are also available on Council's website.

It is important for Council to represent the diverse needs and aspirations of local communities. and Council Elections are an opportunity for voters to elect the candidate they think best represents their community.





Council's focus for the year ahead

At the Council Meeting of 24 June, Council adopted several key plans to guide its future strategic direction.

The adopted documents include the 2024-25 Budget, Council Plan 2021-25 (Revised 2024), Annual Plan 2024–25 and Long-Term Financial Plan (2025-34).

Council is committed to improving local services and facilities for our community, and our strategic priorities for the year ahead ensure the longterm financial sustainability of Council. However, like many households and businesses, we face increased costs.

In 2024-25 Council has committed to investing \$93 million in the capital program, including:


► Dandenong Wellbeing Centre Construction -\$35 million

- ► Keysborough South Community Hub Construction - \$19.74 million
- ► Perry Road Construction and Widening from Greens Road to Pacific Drive - \$4.99 million
- ► Parkfield Reserve Tennis Courts Redevelopment - Northern Courts Construction - \$950,195
- ► Greaves Reserve Oval 4 Lighting Installation - \$584,200.

We will devote \$286,000 to increase the tree planting program throughout our municipality along with \$80,000 on landscape improvements as part of the implementation of our Urban Forest Strategy.

Council will also invest over \$12 million to improve our local roads through the Road Resurfacing, Rehabilitation and Reconstruction programs. biodiversity

CERES summit a sustainable success



Primary school students gathered at Springvale City Hall recently to build their environmental leadership skills.

The 75 students from 12 Greater
Dandenong primary schools took
part in the Student Environment
Leadership Program Summit, which was
delivered in partnership by Council and
environmental education centre CERES.

CERES facilitators helped students understand environmental issues and how they could implement sustainability projects that make a real difference.

Each school left with an individual action plan, which included ideas such as a nude food initiative, how to improve waste management, install water tanks or sell reusable items at the canteen.

The summit set students up to become proactive environmental leaders, equipped with the knowledge and motivation to make meaningful change in their schools and beyond.

One teacher reflected that the summit was a "fantastic opportunity for our school to focus on our sustainability journey and to identify areas that need attention. We received expert advice from the CERES staff to create an action plan that we will take back to school."

The unique project was a collaboration between Council Volunteer of 17 years Ingeborg Thiele, who crocheted the heads, and students from St Anthony's Primary School who painted the bodies of Foxie and KoAla.

Students were proud to be involved with one saying: "It was an honour to be chosen for the project", and another saying: "I loved painting outside with my classmates."

Perform in Our Street NPK



Live music has returned to Noble Park with the Perform in Our Street NPK initiative.

Throughout the 1990s and the early 2000s the Muso Network hosted singers, musicians and songwriters at The Venue, which served as a starting point for many local performers.

Fast forward to 2024 and Our Street NPK recreated this vibe in Noble Park by hosting live outdoor performances in the Frank Street Open Space.

A very talented local performer Kobe White of Australian Idol fame kicked off the series with his glorious vocals, he was joined by another local vocalist ITM and the King of Swing himself, Frankie Davis Jr. – who got crowds up and dancing.



Over

the four sessions, participants enjoyed the best of pop, rock and covers, from Royal Drew, performing alongside DJ Alexandre from RIDDIM Radio.

Families were captivated by Kavita Kalyan's dulcet tones and invited to put on an Indian scarf and learn some dance moves with Bindaas Bollywood crew. With One Voice, who rehearse at Paddy O'Donoghue Centre, were thrilled to perform just across the street from their usual location.

The Perform in Our Street NPK 2024 series concluded with a One Love African Drumming singing and music workshop on Saturday 8 June.

All these activities have been made possible with the support of the Noble Park Revitalisation Board and funding from the Victorian Government.

Delivered in Greater Dandenong 2023-24

The City of Greater Dandenong is a vibrant, diverse and resilient community and Council is proud to work to ensure our city is a great place to live, work, visit and play.

The 2023–24 Budget was a realistic and responsible budget that addressed the growing cost of living and inflationary pressures, while investing in our community. It included a capital works program worth \$58 million, continuing our commitment to invest in community facilities and infrastructure.

Here are some highlights of the projects, services and activities Council delivered in 2023–24.

Ross Reserve Pavilion

Ross Reserve is one of the most popular precincts in Greater Dandenong and is home to the Noble Park Aquatic Centre, Skate Park and sports grounds. Council celebrated the finalisation of three major projects in 2023–24. Including the \$10.8 million Ross Reserve Sports Pavillion, the \$2.3 million Synthetic Soccer Pitch and the \$6 million redevelopment of the Ross Reserve Athletics Facility.





Spring Valley Reserve

Following years of rehabilitation of the previous landfill site, Spring Valley Reserve was opened to the public. In celebration of National Tree Day Council launched the One Tree Per Child program with the largest ever tree planting initiative seen by the international conservation program. More than 800 students from 14 local primary schools planted 2,300 trees and shrubs.

Little Library

A Little Library giving residents the opportunity to collect and return borrowed items without having to visit a library was installed at Menzies Avenue, Dandenong North. The Little Library opened in October 2023, and has so far been used by more than 80 community members to undertake more than 700 loans and carry out more than 140 renewals.



Library services

Every month of the 2023–24 year Dandenong Library welcomed an average of 30,000 visitors while Springvale library welcomed an average of 37,000 visitors each month.

Abbotts Road upgrade

A \$5 million project saw the widening of Abbotts Road to two lanes in each direction. An important transport link, the road helps create a safer link to Dandenong South and Keysborough industrial areas. The project has also made the area safer for pedestrians, vehicles (including larger freight vehicles) and cyclists.

Waste Services

Across four Reuse and Recycle Drop Off Days more than 2,200 vehicles dropped off their household waste items. This included 375 matresses, 136 bikes, 8.55 tonnes of electronic and 28.6 tonnes of steel.

Across the year about 22,000 households booked a hard waste collection, and kerbside collections totalled more than 4.45 million. This included 2.5 million red lid garbage bins, 1.24 million yellow lid recycling bins and almost 700,000 green waste bins.





Noble Park Revitalisation

Noble Park has undergone a transformation with many projects being completed in collaboration with Council and the Noble Park Revitalisation Bord with funding support from the Victorian Government's Suburban Revitalisation Project. The \$2 million project finished on 30 June 2024, and enhanced the village feel of Noble Park's activity centre with a number of public art projects and activations, including live music performances in community spaces.

Frederick Wachter Reserve

In 2023 the new playground was opened at Frederick Wachter Reserve. Following extensive community consultation the playground was built featuring two distinct themes – market gardens and wetlands.

Herbert Street Pocket Park

Council completed a pocket park at 77 Herbert Street, including exercise equipment, a sensory garden, seating and new trees. The project complemented the planting of 278 trees along Herbert Street, which created a green spine designed to increase shade and create a corridor to help wildlife travel safely.

Railway Parade upgrades

The Railway Parade shopping strip underwent an upgrade following feedback from the community. The inviting changes include new paving, street trees that will increase shade, as well as new landscaping, seating and other street furniture. A pocket park at 218 Railway Parade was also completed.

George Andrews Reserve

Across 2023-24 two major projects were completed at Dandenong's George Andrews Reserve, including a verandah added to the pavilion to give spectators more protection from the elements. A new mural celebrating the city's links to the Macedonian village of Keshava was also painted on the pavilion.

Blackspot Funding for road projects

New traffic lights and pedestrian crossing at Corrigan Road and Harold Road intersection, Noble Park \$517,790.

Nine safety treatments, including raised platforms and intersections and lighting upgrades on Bloomfield Road, Noble Park \$671, 232.

Raised pedestrian crossing near a school in Browns Road, Noble Park \$394,896.

Raised platforms and line markings on Outlook Drive, Dandenong North \$138,634.

Festivals and Events

Every year Council celebrates our vibrant and diverse community through a range of festivals and events, including the Greater Dandenong Children's Festival, Springvale Snow Fest, Discoer Dandenong Creek Festival, Keysborough's Big Picnic, Noble Park Community Fun Day, Sustainability Festival and Carols in Harmony Square. About 80,000 people attended our events across the year.

Mr Rehman has invested countless hours of time, effort, energy and love into making his store the successful clothing boutique that it is today.


"Without the help of my wife, my three daughters and my son, this business is impossible.

Corporate Citizen of the Year – Vanessa Field

Vanessa Field has been the Director of Springvale Service for Children for 10 years, and her passion for accessible family services is just as compelling now as it was a decade ago.

"This role brings me so much joy, knowing we are giving families and children the best possible start. It's not the hundreds of people we do it for, it's for the one person who otherwise might fall through the cracks - that is what drives me," said Vanessa.

Springvale Service for Children provides a toy library, playgroup, early learning programs, and a range of supports for families to break down the barriers to accessing early education and family services.

"We see a lot of vulnerable people who may have never had access to their own education, so they have no idea where to start for their children and grandchildren."

Vanessa says the toy library is a great way to welcome people to the centre.

"People walk past and see something their children would like, they come in and are met by our wonderful staff and volunteers who can provide guidance on how to access further support services."

Being named Corporate Citizen of the Year came as a pleasant surprise to Vanessa, who has been working hard to build the sustainability of all local children's services.

She says Springvale Service for Children is a community asset, rather than a service.

"It's somewhere the whole family can grow and connect. If they are experiencing cultural barriers, financial disadvantage or social isolation, we provide a safe space to get together and talk about what they want for their children and how we can best support them."



Knitwork celebrates 10-year milestone



Local knitters have been meeting weekly at Dandenong Library for a decade, creating

much-needed items for charity while enjoying good conversation.

A Cultural Threads project brought the group together 10 years ago, to create a welcome mat for the library. Participants enjoyed the project so much, they decided to continue their catch ups, forming the Social Knitwork Group.

"Many knitters don't have an outlet for their knitting, so when we came together for the project we thought why not keep it going," said Margaret Boyd, one of the founding members.

Margaret was knitting for designers and charities at the time and has enjoyed sharing her expertise with less experienced knitters.



"We have people at all levels, some crochet as well. The social aspect is wonderful, it gives people somewhere to go and an opportunity to enjoy a great chat. We solve many of the world's problems on a Wednesday morning!"

"The generosity of people is amazing. We welcome all donations and thank everyone who has contributed over the years," said Margaret.
