How You Can Help

Scan the QR codes individually that will open a pre-written email that you can send immediately to Federal and State MPs.

You also have the option to personalise each message by sharing your own experiences or concerns. Personal stories make a powerful impact and can help decision-makers better understand the real challenges faced by our community.

The Anti-Poverty Steering Committee has already met with several local MPs to discuss the urgent need for action. However, there are still MPs who have yet to respond or meet with the committee. By sending the email below, you will be helping to ensure that all our representatives are engaged in addressing poverty.

Steps to Take Action:



1 **Open camera & scan the first QR code** to open the email addressed to your Federal MPs.

2 **Review the email** - you can send it as is or personalise it with your own story.



3 **Sign off with your name** or organisation name.

4 **Hit send** – your message will go directly to your MP's inbox.



5 **Scan Next QR Codes and repeat** the above steps to send the emails to the Upper & Lower House State MPs.
