May look at creating a story with a service provider ○ Hobsons Bay – Creating short film with service providers – focus on impact of SRSS cuts ○ Monash – Narrative based on series of photos • Members raised important considerations regarding participants: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Need to protect participants from potential racism and hate speech that may arise on social media, by promptly moderating comments ○ Need to inform participants about the purpose of the content and what it will be used for – suggestion of a one-pager to communicate to potential participants explaining about potential social media risk and identifying Taskforce’s duty of care ○ Need to obtain clear consent from participants • Notification of Cultural Diversity Week: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Opportunity to have campaign petitions ready to sign at events organised by or participated in by member Councils ○ Petitions in multiple languages will increase signatures • Campaign Objectives: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Expanding campaign coalition – identifying community organisations to support the campaign – church groups, aid agencies, volunteer groups ○ Campaign petition needs to mobilise numbers rapidly ○ Those attending agreed with Youhorn’s suggestion that there be a paper version of the petition • Take action – Email Your MP Found on campaign website – aimed at more politically engaged individuals to send letter to their local MPs.
